REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

Canada Makes a Particularly Good Showing for the Past Six Months.

OTTAWA, Jan. 12-(Special)-A stateent of the revenue and expenditure of the Dominion has been issued by the f nance department. For six months endir time in the previous year, an increase of \$5,817,549 The expenditure was \$24,695,166, over \$1,000,000 less than for 1905 so that there was a betterment of nearly \$7,000,-

There was an increase in every branch of the public service, the customs showing \$3,750,000. On capital account there was an expenditure of over \$16,000,000, about \$500,000 greater than for the same
