Cambridge, Mass., Nov. 21.—Harvard triumphed over Yale yesterday by a record-breaking score of 41 to 0. No other Harvard team ever administered such a defeat to the blue. Captain Edward W. Mahan, of the Harvard team, ended his football career in a blaze of glory, for he scored five touchdowns against Yale and kicked four goals. Yale once stood on Harvard's six yard line, but could not get an inch farther.

Wright Will Coach Penn.

Toronto, Nov. 20.—"I will be glad indeed to coach the crews and oarsmen of the University of Pennsylvania," said Joe Wright, honorary coach of the Argonaut Rowing Club, last night, "but in an honorary capacity only. I am an amateur first and last and would not consider the acceptance of a salary. If it is possible for me to secure leave of absence from my work here, I would esteem it an honor to take up the coaching of the Pennsylvania candidates."
