AN ACT

To Incorporate the Halifax Association for Improving the Condition of the Poor.

(Passed the 19th day of April, 1884.)

Be it enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows:

- 1. John Doull, William H. Neal, Samuel M. Brookfield, William L. Lowell, and such other persons as now are or shall hereafter become members of the Association hereby incorporated, are hereby constituted, a body corporate by the name of "The Halifax Association for Improving the Condition of the Poor."
- 2. The Association hereby incorporated may take, purchase and hold real estate and personal property, and may sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the same for the purposes of the said Association.
- 3. The Association hereby incorporated shall have power to make by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of the said Association, the admission of members, the appointment of officers, and for the promotion and carrying out of its purposes.
- 4. The Annual Meeting of the said Association shall be held in the month of November in each year, and at such Annual Meetings the officers of the Association for the then next ensuing year shall be appointed. The persons who at the passing of this Act hold office in the said Association shall continue to be the officers thereof until the first Annual Meeting is held.
- 5. No officer or member of the Association hereby incorporated shall be liable for any debt or obligation of the said Association, unless he shall agree to be answerable therefor.
