NEW YORK, March 4—Strong buying support was in evidence at the opening of today's stock market and prices rallied briskly from their closing quotations of yesterday. Cast Iron Pipe, Hudson Motors, Erie Railroad common and Allied Chemical. Necessary liquidation was still in evidence in a few scattered issues,

MONTREAL, March 4-Consolidated Smelters suffered a further break of twenty points during the first half hour's trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange this morning. The issue opened at 185, down five, firmed to 188, and later, under an avalanche of selling orders eased to 170, which represents a loss of 70 points since the present movement began, Tuesday. Montreal Power was another soft spot, selling down two points at 209½. Brazilian eased one point at 863-4.


