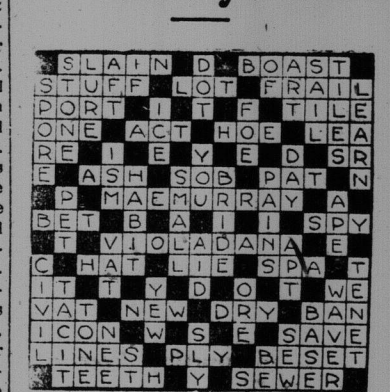

Here is Answer to Saturday's Puzzle



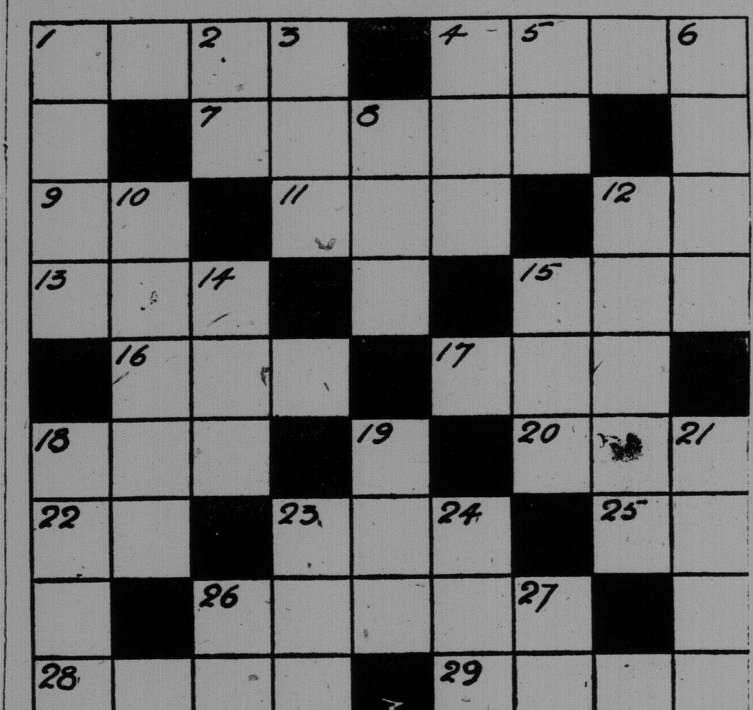
CROSS-WORD PUZZLE

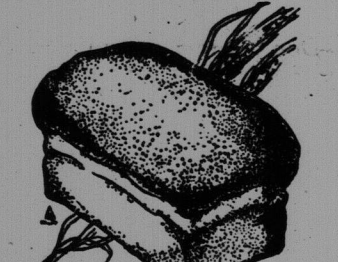
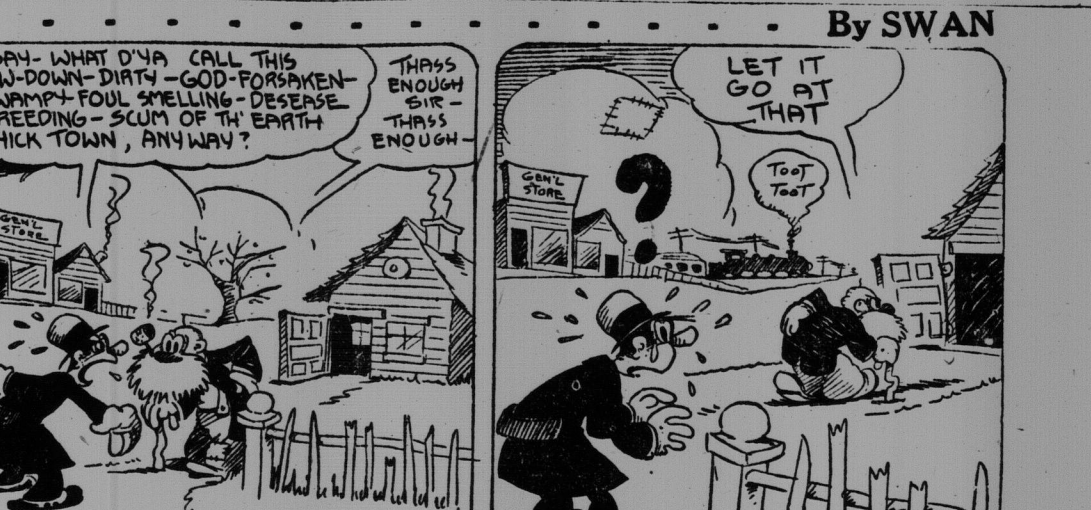

Here is Another Wonder Doll House

London, Dec. 1.—A doll's house which has taken C. F. Kingsby, of Finsbury, two years to make, is being shown to visitors at his house, on behalf of the Royal Northern Hospital. The Queen, who saw photographs of the house, has favorably commented on its appearance.

With the exception of the Queen's doll's house, Mr. Kingsby's model must be the best equipped in the country. It is 4 ft. 6 in. long and 28 in. back to front. It is beautifully decorated inside and out, and every joint is dovetailed or socketed, and fitted up without the use of glue.

When a newspaper man was "shown over" this miniature seven-roomed house, he found the place in darkness, but with a few switch operations in the storeroom the "mansion" was flooded with electric light.

On the parquet steps outside a little "girl" was playing with a dog. In the kitchen a cat was on the table after a china chicken.

In the hall the telephone was placed handsomely close to a grandfather clock, pictures on the walls gave a handsome appearance, and in the dining-room there was every evidence of good cheer including microscopic delectables of real "Scottish" gin, and port on the sideboard. Doll-dom has not yet gone entirely dry.

The bathroom was a delight. There of

was even a little piece of soap and tooth and nail brushes were there. Everything in the house has been made by hand, not forgetting the cement fastenings and the "ren" matchboxes in the tiny candlesticks. A flow of water runs from the taps, and the plumbing throughout is so perfect that if the house were left out in the rain the gutters and rainpipes would carry off the rain.

On the roof there are 1,400 tiles, and every one of the 208 panes of glass has been put in by hand. There is nothing jerry-built about this desirable residence—the sashes do not jam, the walls can be cleaned, the doors swing silently and with ease. No loose door knobs betray bad workmanship.

The miniature candles will light, the billiard balls (spot and plain) can be played with the cues in the billiard-room. There is an egg-cup on the dining-room table. Five dolls enjoy themselves in this luxurious house.

Teeth of Millions Years Ago Found

London, Dec. 1.—Prehistoric discoveries have been made at Virginia Wat during boring operations at a depth nearly 1,400 ft.

Teeth resembling those of shari believed to be millions of years old, and telling of a period when this land was under the ocean, were found.
