



DECLARES PEOPLE OF GERMANY WERE MISLED AS TO WAR

Editor Harden Says Kaiser Kept Alive National Hatred

PAINED TO MAKE ADMISSION

Says Emperor Drawn in Against Will But is to Bane for Methods of War for Which World Will Never Pardon Him — William III Again

Brussels, Feb. 19.—(British Wireless Service)—Maximilian Harden, editor of Die Zukunft, of Berlin, in an interview in Le Hoir, of Brussels, declares that the German people were misled as to the cause of the war.

"Our people," said Harden, "did not know and do not know now, they were misled as to the cause of the war. They believed that right was on their side. If they had not, they would not have fought and suffered as they did. They believed there was a coalition against Germany. They did not understand that Great Britain, France and Russia had no other object than to protect themselves against the adverse designs of the Kaiser.

"They did not understand that the violation of Belgium was a crime which turned the enlightened universe against Germany. They are still certain that if Germany had not invaded Belgium, Great Britain and France were ready to do so. Personally, I do not think France ever thought of such a thing, and if she had Great Britain would not have permitted it.

"But it was an old idea of the Kaiser. In one of his outbursts he once said to Leopold II.—'If there is war I shall go through Belgium. If she resists, Belgium will not exist any longer.'

"It is the thirty years of reign of William II, which carried responsibility for the war. It is the preaching in which he has poisoned youth. It is the spirit

AFRICAN AGITATORS HOTLY DENOUNCED IN LEGISLATURE

Condemnation of Move for Severance from Britain

Capetown, South Africa, Feb. 18.—(Canadian Press despatch from Reuter's Limited)—In the legislative assembly today Sir Thomas Smuts, leader of the opposition, moved that the house condemn the agitation now being carried on for the dissolution of the union and the severance of the connection now existing between South Africa and Great Britain. He further expressed the opinion that such agitation, if persisted in, would lead to civil war and bloodshed in South Africa.

In the course of his speech, Sir Thomas condemned the republican propaganda and quoted from the speech of the late well-known Dutch leader, Jan Hofmeyr, in which he declared that Afrikaners have an actual interest in the maintenance of the British Empire and that the protection of the powerful British fleet. Sir Thomas asked where the liberties of South Africa would be today but for the British navy, which reminded the house that Hofmeyr himself went to England and gave the passage of the South African Act of Union his blessing. He ridiculed the suggestion of British domination and pointed out that there was not much domination when the long-tongued treason of the Nationalists was being heard all over the land. He proceeded to refer humorously to the wild goose chase on which the Nationalist deputations were going to Europe and said it would meet a well-deserved fate. The Nationalists would sail with government passports protected by the British navy, to ask President Wilson to break up the Union of South Africa. They were going to President Wilson, who stood for the non-severance of the United States of America and the maintenance of the integrity of those states by all possible means. These same Nationalist leaders had previously protested against outsiders interfering with the internal affairs of South Africa. These people who are trying to break up the union were a section of one section of the people of South Africa. Sir Thomas said that a section was not only against the people of South Africa, but against the peoples of the empire. The danger of civil war and bloodshed was imminent, if this protest were made and the assistance of the sister dominions invoked.

Dominions Interested.

Were not Australia, New Zealand and India interested in the maintenance of the integrity of South Africa in the Southern Seas?

Acting Premier Malan moved an amendment to the effect that the house, coming to a constitutional development which would make the union in the full sense a self-governing dominion, emphasize the importance of the union and the severance of the connection between South Africa and Great Britain and also to invite the house to invoke the severance from any outside power. The house wishes to record its opinion that, notwithstanding all protestations to the contrary, the union is in its essence a self-governing dominion, and the subversion of the fundamental provisions of the constitution as laid down by the South African Act, which was framed by the representatives of the people of the people of South Africa, and it continued will inevitably lead to a state of unrest and racial friction in which civil strife easily be engendered.

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MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Hon. P. J. Veniot, who was in the city last evening, pointed out that the proposed arrangement for the distribution of federal aid for road building would not work out fairly to the eastern provinces. In other provinces where the municipalities contribute towards the upkeep of the roads it will be possible to expend large sums and so take advantage of the offer, but in New Brunswick the amount of money at the disposal of the provincial department of public works would not be sufficient to allow the province to secure anything like its fair share of the federal grant on the basis of a contribution of forty per cent on work done.

As a tribute to the late Sir Wilfrid Laurier, the president of the Canadian Pacific Railway has directed that at 10.30 a. m. Saturday (11.30 St. John time) when the funeral is scheduled to start, every train on the vast system, from the Atlantic to the Pacific, shall stop, and every activity throughout the system shall cease for one minute.

FOOD RIOTS ON THE ISLAND OF MAJORCA

Madrid, Feb. 19.—Serious food riots have broken out at Palma, Majorca, one of the largest islands in the Spanish Balearic group. The market halls were plundered and destroyed. All the stores and cafes have been closed. Soldiers are guarding the streets and railway stations.

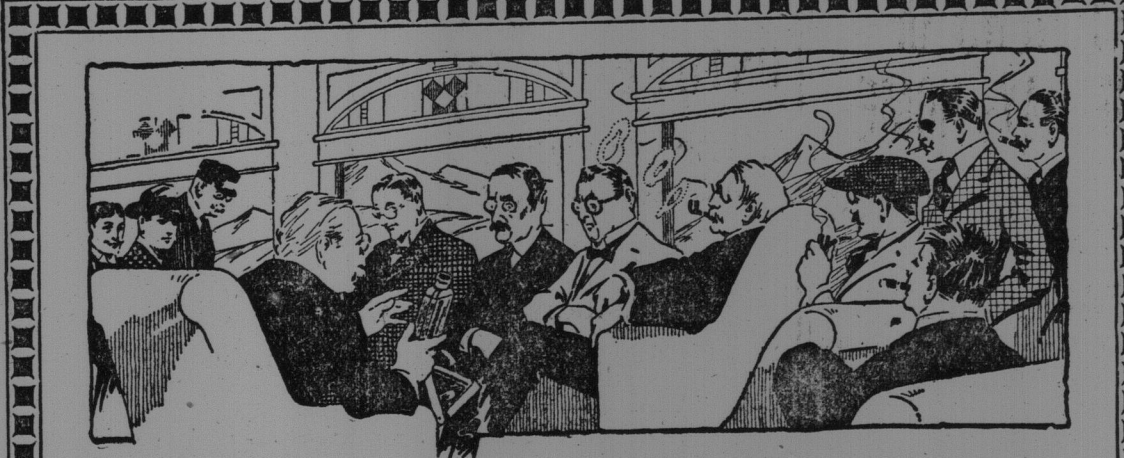
MILLIONS FOR SEACOAST DEFENCES ARE VOTED

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LABOR FEDERATION ACTS ON LIQUOR

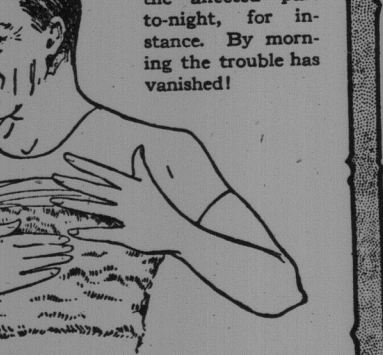
Alberta Resolution Votes Down Decision of Brewery Workers Who Called for Stronger Beer

The Alberta Federation of Labor in session in Medicine Hat, declared unequivocally against any modification of the prohibition legislation in this province. This action was taken after considering a resolution introduced by the Calgary Brewery Workers asking the federation to approach the Alberta government in the view of having the strength of beer raised to 2-1/2 per cent. alcohol. Brewery workers claimed that if the resolution were adopted, it would not increase drunkenness but diminish it, and bootlegging would not be so prevalent. That the federation should demand of the government a rigid enforcement of the present law was the suggestion made by the opposition, who claimed this would be the proper method of eliminating boot-legging. The resolution was defeated.

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BOHEMIA SCARCE OF COAL AND WOOD

Street Cars on Half Schedule and Lights Fewer Than in Vienna

Prague, Feb. 19.—(By the Associated Press)—The Allied mission proceeding to Poland to investigate the territorial disputes between the Government of Poland and Czechoslovakia was welcomed cordially by the Czechs when it passed through Prague on the way to Warsaw. The railway station and the city buildings were decorated with the Allied colors.

Prominent Czechs say that Bohemia is suffering in the matter of coal, sugar and food. The street cars here are running on half of the normal schedule and there are fewer lights at night than in Vienna. Food in the hotels and restaurants is more scarce than six weeks ago.

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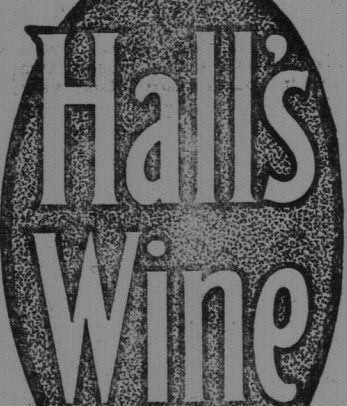
