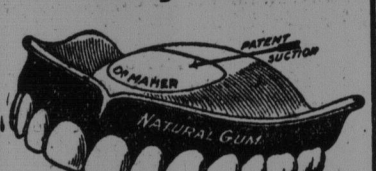
BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Bangor young man, Reginald McAdam

Patricia Regiment in the trenches. He
was twice wounded and one of his
wounds, although received in June, 1917,
is still open, and when asked why it did
not heal he replied, "Poison shrapnel."
Returning from France to England,
while wounded, the hospital ship Llan-
very Castle, on which he was a pas-
senger, was torpedoed without warning
by the gentle Hun. For seven hours
he was adrift, being finally picked up
by a destroyer. He has a bullet wound
in his neck only an eighth of an inch
from his jugular vein; a machine gun
bullet went through his liver, and he
has had both legs broken in action. In
fact, Reginald is a man clear through.





GERMAN HUMOR
