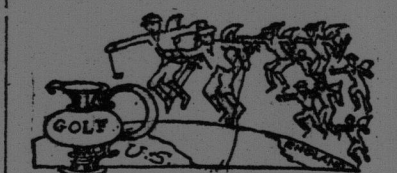

PREPARING FOR THE EXHIBITION

The first work in connection with the provincial exhibition buildings was commenced this week. Manager H. A. Porter has started a gang of men repairing the entrances. The plank walk up to the main doorway is being taken up and will probably be replaced by an asphalt pavement.

The north fence along side the armory is being raised high enough to prevent the entrance of dead heads and a general repairing of all the fences is being undertaken.

Inside the main building, a second gang of men is at work tearing down old booths which will either not be used again or have been abandoned by firms not exhibiting this fall.

Repairs are also being made to the restaurant. New sills are being placed, and the roof is being repaired.

A gang of city workmen under supervision of Commissioner McLellan, and building inspector Carleton are busy making needed repairs to the main building.

Outside the cattle sheds and horse stalls have been completely over hauled and new

trains put in. There is only remaining the addition of a coat of whitewash to make them all ready for the big fair.
