And whereas it has been found expedient to give effect to the said Section 58, in so far as regards the importation of swine, and to alter the terms of the Regulations for this purpose, adopted by Order in Council of 22nd of May, 1868:

His Excellency, on the recommendation of the illonorable the Minister of Customs and under the provisions of the said Act has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of May, 1868, and the Regulations thereby establised be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the following Regulations thereby establised be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the following Regulations be and are hereby adopted and established in fieu thereof—that is to say.
