IN NEWFOUNDLAND.

A Halifax man who returned from Newfoundland on Tuesday last was in the city last Sunday. He said the talk about the island wishing to annex to the United States is merely the idea of a few political cranks incited by a number of New Englanders who would like very much to see Newfoundland a part of the republic.

These men are doing all in their power to make the masses believe that it would be the best thing that could happen to them, but this gentleman says, they are not succeeding and will never be able to succeed, for the simple reason that Newfoundlanders are all too fond of England. While a few persons seem to favor annexation, this feeling is by no means universal.

The islanders would, he thinks, like to become independent, but as they realize now as they never did before that this can never be, they are considering confederation more seriously than ever before. This has never been a live issue on the island, but the leading men are beginning to feel that confederation with Canada would be the best move Newfoundland could make.
