Pious Wish of Senator Jeff Davis—Unsuccessfully Opposed Laying of Oil Pipe Line.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—Senator Jeff Davis of Arkansas started the senate today with the declaration that he would like to see John D. Rockefeller consigned to perdition and burned in flames caused by the consumption of the products of the Standard Oil Company.

He spoke in opposition to a bill authorizing an oil and gas pipe line across the public lands of Arkansas. Accusing Senator Owen, sponsor of the bill, of a business connection with the Standard Oil Company, he engaged in a spirited colloquy with that senator.

The bill was passed at a previous session of the senate and was recalled by Mr. Owen to accommodate Mr. Davis. In his speech Mr. Davis contended that the admission of the pipe line into Arkansas would violate the anti-trust laws of his state. He said that he was the only place he would be willing to see the Standard Oil Company's line and that he would be glad to see Mr. Rockefeller incinerated in the flames caused by his own oil.

Mr. Owen denied all connection with the Standard Oil Company and said that the oil in Oklahoma could be got out only through pipe lines crossing Arkansas. On the passage of the bill, Mr. Davis cast the only negative vote.

HORRIBLE TREATMENT

OF HIS YOUNG WIFE

Paris Pharmacist Kept Her in Chains for Two Years—Child Was Born Without Attendance.

PARIS, Feb. 17.—The disappearance of the young wife of a druggist named Paré, whose pharmacy is near the scene of the Steinhilber murder, was cleared up today when the police broke in and found the woman heavily chained between the bed and the wall, horribly scared.

In addition to the chain, which was strongly padlocked around the neck, a cruel contrivance resembling a coat of mail but suspended by a belt of copper rings, enveloped the body. Both objects could be removed only by the use of keys.

The woman told a pitiful tale of two years' imprisonment and misery. Last November, while still in chains, she gave birth to her fifth child. The husband refused to call a doctor. Paré, who was arrested, declared that he loved his wife, but was extremely jealous of her.

TWO SUFFOCATED IN

HAMILTON, ONT., FIRE

HAMILTON, Ont., Feb. 18.—Two men are dead, three are seriously injured, and a score or more are painfully bruised as the result of a fire which broke out about 5:30 yesterday afternoon at the immense plant of the Currier Tilden Company, stove manufacturers, Hugbush and Rebecca streets, Henri Javelin, King street, West, and Albert McCully, 237 Catherine street, North, were suffocated to death, their bodies being found half an hour after the fire broke out.
