The B. A. O. G. Ts. of Ontario, at their last session, held in Guelph, the 5th of October, 1872, appointed a Committee on Union, which was met by the Ontario members of your Committee with the result as reported by your special delegate to meet that body on Union. (See Report of Rev. G. A. Mitchell, B. A.)

The B. A. O. G. Ts. of Quebec have corresponded with your Committee

expressing the same sentiments as their Ontario brethren.

The Sons of Temperance, of Quebec, in answer to the Union circular, have expressed themselves in warm sympathy with the movement, and have appointed a Committee to meet yours, or any other, on the subject.

From P. E. Island we have a communication from the Sons of Temperance, through their Grand Scribe, cordially reciprocating the sentiments expressed in our circular, hoping the day is not far distant when the pro-

posed Union shall be effected.

Your Committee feel convinced that the signs of the times plainly indicate a deep and growing interest on the subject of Temperance Union, and being convinced that the steps you have already taken are very important, as being the means of initiating a very desirable movement, would recommend that a standing Committee on the subject of union be appointed for the next year, with Bro.
