Many Public Franchises Scattered to the Winds

Mr. W. Frank Hatheway Shows How the Old Administrators of Public Affairs in this Province Gave Away Great Water Powers and Mineral Rights for a Mere Song—Member for Victoria Greatest Franchise Grabber in Province—Labor Legislation and Immigration Matters.

In the debate on the reply to the speech of the House last week, Mr. W. Frank Hatheway made one of his characteristic forceful addresses, marked by that deep thought and moderation for which the member for St. John is noted.

Mr. Hatheway said that he sympathized with the remarks made by the representative of St. John county regarding the education system in the province. He congratulated the mover and seconder of the address and with his fellow members he felt a deep personal regret at the loss sustained in the death of the late Mr. Robinson. He regretted that several members were absent from their places on account of illness, and especially did he regret the sickness of his colleague, Dr. McInerney. To the activity and influence of Dr. McInerney was largely due the Public Health Act which was upon our Statute Book today, and it was his influence that initiated the tuberculosis sanatorium movement. He felt that the whole province would appreciate the generosity of that deep hearted, kind hearted woman who had given so liberally to benefit the suffering in her native province.

When he heard the Hon. leader of the Opposition the other day discussing the school book question and heard him largely due to his influence in 1907-8 to bring in a bill reducing the price of school books, he could not forget how that Hon. gentleman in 1903 and subsequent years had forgotten to reduce the price of school books, and it was only on the very eve of his defeat that he admitted possibly those prices could be reduced. The very first action of the Hon. Government in 1908 was to reduce the price of most school books by 40 per cent.

The Immigration Question.

The question of immigration was one receiving the consideration of the Government, and one of the good things they had done was to move the New Brunswick immigration office to a part of London, and he thought it would be practically impossible for a Yorkshire farmer, who wanted to obtain some information about New Brunswick, to find it in London. There were three narrow streets with similar names and it took nearly two hours to find the office in a narrow court, not a sign of the way. This Government acted wisely in moving the office to the vicinity of the Strand, adjacent to the great arteries of trade and commerce. He was glad to see that the Government intended pursuing an active policy of immigration. He did not believe it was for any government to try and get rid of any other part of Canada. We should try and obtain good immigrants from other countries. The whole scheme of immigration promotion conducted by Mr. Bowden in England was admirable. He goes into the small cities and into the country places of England, Scotland and Ireland and he tells the intelligent and better class of immigrants and by relating his own experiences as a farmer in this province, gives an intelligent idea of what farming life in New Brunswick is like and was able to tell them intelligently of the splendid opportunities awaiting them here, and in that way he has been successful in sending out intelligent and better class of immigrants. He thought the regulations with regard to settlers, each being able to take up one hundred acres of land should be amended so as to provide for four or five persons in one family acquiring five or six hundred acres of land, and after living upon it for three years it becomes theirs in fee simple. He believed settlers should not be given a title to the land until they had been upon it five to seven years. By that time they would have improved it and have become so attached to it that they would remain there and become permanent settlers and good citizens. He did not think it would be wise for the government to sell out its lands by people from other provinces of the Dominion and he understood that some considerable settlements were being made along the line of the International Railway by people coming from an adjoining province. He thought immigration should be encouraged from Great Britain, from France, Denmark and Sweden, as it was in those countries a sturdy industrial desirable land should be encouraged. He thought it would be wise for the government to set aside at least two miles on either side of the Grand Trunk Pacific, where it ran through good agricultural lands, or Crown lands, for agricultural settlements. Of course the lumbermen would object to that, but men are worth more than trees and the interests of the farmers and settlers and the future agricultural prosperity of the province should outweigh all consideration of immediate benefit of the lumber interests.

Gave Away Public Franchises.

Considerable had been heard in the House and in the country about the giving away of public franchises. We had in this House a representative from Victoria County, who was very fond of getting possession of all possible water powers, and seemed to have an eye single to that object, and if there was a greater river in Heaven the Hon. gentleman would try to get some of it, and dam it. In 1903 the Hon. gentleman had promoted a company called the Maine and Acadia Electric Co., that had secured possession of water fall in this province that at a conservative estimate equals five thousand horse power, and reckoning each horse power worth only five dollars, at the dam, there was a franchise in the province worth \$25,000 a year. How much did the people of the province get for that great franchise acquired by the friends of the Hon. member for Victoria?
