I suggest that this question should be put back on the order paper, for the answer given by the Wheat Board is most evasive, to say the least. Indeed, one wonders whether the answer was given in that way in order to conceal the fabulous increase in storage during the last year owing to the loss of markets and other reasons.

The amount of storage costs incurred by the board on wheat in the 1968/69 crop year is not yet available.

Mr. Diefenbaker: Mr. Speaker, I answer that immediately. The question was asked on May 27. I did not ask about the entire crop; I asked for the amount for this year, as of that date. The hon. gentleman's attempt to cover up the answer which was given does not help us to arrive at accurate figures.
