OLIVIER, *Hon.* Louis Auguste, *Q. C. L.*

S. of Maxime Olivier, Esq., a retired militia officer, who served during the war of 1812. Grands. of Louis Olivier, Esq., who sat for county of Warwick in the Legislative Assembly of L. C. M. in Nov., 1854, Dlle. Marie R. Masse. Called to the Bar, L. C., Sept. 1839. Created *Q. C.*, 1864. Represented De Lanaudière division in Leg. Council, Can. (for which he was an unsuccessful candidate in 1862) from 1863 until the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—*Berthier-en-haut, P. Q.*

PRICE, *Lieut. Col.* David Edward, *J. P. C.*

S. of the late William Price Esq., an extensive lumber merchant at Quebec and the Saguenay, and of Jane, his wife, third dau. of the late Charles G. Stewart Esq., Comptroller of the Imperial Customs at Quebec. Family originally from Wales. B. and ed. at Quebec. Is engaged in large lumbering operations on the Saguenay. Agent for Kingdom of Denmark on the Saguenay.
