

emigrated from Tours, France, and held the "Monument Farm," upon which the celebrated battles of Quebec were fought, 1759-60. B. in Quebec, 15 Jan., 1831. Ed. at the Quebec Seminary, and the High School of the same city. M., 1861, Victoria Adeline, dau. of the late Augustus Jourdain, Esq., Librarian to the Leg. Council of L.C. A Notary Public, and a Lieut.-Col. of the Quebec East Militia. Was for a considerable period a mem. of the Quebec City Corporation, and upon four occasions elected Mayor of that city. An unsuccessful candidate for Montmorenci in Can. Assembly, g.e., 1863. First returned to Parlt. for present seat, July, 1870, on resignation of sitting mem.; re-elected, by acclamation, at last g.e. A Conservative, and a supporter of the present Govt. Is in favor of the Confederation of all the B.N.A. possessions and of the construction of the Pacific Railway, the improvement of Canals and other means of communication with the West—reciprocal trade with the United States—and generally of a liberal emigration and railway policy.—*Little River, near Quebec*; 42 St. Joseph St., St. Rochs, Que.
