Seigniories of Boucherville and Montarville. running from the St. Lawrence south-easterly along said boundary lines, to the depth of Montarville, on the rear line of the Seigniory of Chambly, thence north-easterly along said rear line, to the south-west boundary line of the Seigniory of Belæil; thence south-easterly along said boundary line to the River Richelieu or Chambly, and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence, nearest to the said County, and in the whole or in part fronting the same, and all the Islands in the said River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly, nearest to the said County, and in the whole or in part opposite thereto on that side. The County of Kent shall be bounded on the north-east by the southwest boundary line of the County of Surrey; on the south-west by the north east boundary line of the Seigniory of Laprairie, running from the St. Lawrence south-easterly along said boundary line to the depth of said Seigniory, thence along the rear line of the said Seigniory, southwesterly to the north-cast boundary line of the Seigniory Delery, thence south-casterly along said boundary line to the River Richelieu or Chambly, and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River St. Lawrence, nearest to the said County, and in whole or in part fronting the same, together also with all the Islands in the said River Sorel, Richelieu or Chambly nearest to the said County, and in whole or in part opposite thereto, on that side. The County two of Huntingdon shall be bounded on the north-east by the south west boundary line of the County of Kent, and on the south by the southern boundary of the Province, on the east by the River Richelieu or Chambly, and on the north-west by the River St. Lawrence, and shall comprehend all the Islands in the said River: St. Lawrence, and in the said River Sorel, otherwise called the Richelieu or Chambly, nearest to the said County. The County of York, including the Islands Perrot and Bizarre, shall be bounded on the north-east by the south-west boundary line of the Seigniory of Blainville, running from a branch of the Ottawa River along said boundary; north-west, to the east boundary line of the augmentation to the Seignfory of the Lake of two Mountains; thence along said boundary line, northerly, to the north-easterly angle thereof; thence along, the rear line of said augmentation, westerly, to its north-west angle; and from thence, by a line due north west, to the northern boundary of the Province, on the south, partly by the waters of the Offawa, and partly by the waters of the Saint Lawrence; on the west partly by the boundary line between the Provinces of Upper and Lower-Canada; extending along said boundary line from the St. Lawrence to the Ottawa, and partly by the Grand or Otta-
