Ibelieve it may be considered that below the Stout Fort in which our known as the Cleverals & St Peter Parished those are about 110 Families not recruing Treaty money as hedians & 170 receiving such money that will used beliveen them about 1350 Bushels of seed wheat besides seed Potatoes.
