They have in fact got a living  
from casual fishing from day  
to day under the ice and from  
partridges and other hunting a  
very hard thing at present when  
rabbits and most wild animals  
are so scarce. -

The urgent necessity is, however,  
the supply of seed for their farms.

I believe it may be considered  
that below the Stone Fort in which  
are known as St. Clement's & St. Peter's  
Parishes there are about 110 families  
not receiving Treaty money as Indians  
& 170 receiving such money that will  
need between them about 1350 Bushels  
of seed wheat besides seed Potatoes.
