BUT THERE ARE NO TORIES

Messrs. Bennett and Stevens cried "Shame!" in the House last week when the Prime Minister expressed unwillingness to give money out of the federal treasury to any Tory government in this country for alleged unemployment purposes. He expressed less hardness of heart toward the Progressive premiers of the Western Provinces, but for premiers with policies diametrically opposed to Liberalism there would be no such federal aid.

One of the Saskatchewan members on the opposition side, Milton N. Campbell, commented in rather an illuminating manner on the Prime Minister's statement. Heassumed that under such circumstances, no federal relief would be given to the province of Saskatchewan. The present government in Saskatchewan is Conservative, but it is endeavoring to hold the United Farmer and independent support in the legislature by describing itself as co-operative.

Mr. Campbell classed it with the Tory

governments when he said last Friday that Mr. Mackenzie King's position would mean the depriving of Saskatchewan of any relief. Mr. Mackenzie King would describe Premier Anderson as a Tory. Mr. Campbell refrained from similarly identifying him, but apparently admitted that he is in the Tory class without saying it in so many words
