We are in receipt of a copy of your letter of the 3rd ultimo addressed to the Department of the Interior with reference to certain St. Peters Reserve lands.

The Fractional S. E. 1/4 of Section 19, Town-ship 14, Range 5 East, excepting legal sub-divisions one and eight comprises L.S. Dvs. 2 and 7, stand on our records in the name of the original purchaser James C. Simpson, Winnipeg, Manitoba. The land is paid for in full, but the Patent has not issued.

The lien under St. Peters Reserve Act against this land amounts to eighty (\$80.00) dollars principal and thirty-sevendellars and sixty-five (\$37.65) cents interest computed to the 30th instant totaling one hundred and seventeen dollars and sixty-five (\$117.65) cents.

The sum necessary to discharge the lien against the Fractional L.S.D. 13-29-14-5 East computed as above amounts to twenty-seven dollars and twenty (\$27.30) cents made up of eighteen dollars and fifty (\$18.50) cents principal and eight dollars and seventy (\$8.70) cents interest.
