Heavy demands for tires are causing some concorn and a study is being made to increase production capacities.

6. Steel Situation:

Under the general category of steel we are experiencing extreme difficulty in keeping our program anywhere near up-to-date, as a result of shortages. In one instance delivery of transport vehicles urgently required in the United Kingdom was oro month late owing to non-delivery of steel sheets.

The forward picture for the balance of 1941 does not appear certain owing to the steel supply situation.
