Further to our recent telephone conversation re Gub Aircraft CF-BUQ, we herewith report the following:

CF-BUQ, pilot E. C. Dauphinee and pupil, no injury to person nel, during flying instructional flight on December 15, 1945 at approximately 1130 hours, while teaching gliding and forced landing procedure, using a frozen ice area at Sutherland's River Mouth, Pictou County, Nova Scotia for approach. Opened engines at 200 feet, as engines did not properly pick up completed landing on ice. After coming to stop, wheels gradually sank through ice immersing undercarriage, carburetor and lower part of main frame. Aircraft removed from water within three hours. We are now cleaning and washing all effected parts by removing fuselage covering all control cables in contact with salt water, thoroughly cleaning and inspecting all parts. No mechanical damage resulted.
