



At the Easter meeting of 1908, the question of building a larger church in S. George's parish was discussed, and in June, 1909, the work of building began. The corner stone of the new church was laid by the Bishop of the diocese on Sept. 1909. Services were

held at Crown Mortlock's School and Newberry's in 1908, the Rev. A. B. Payne took Mr. McMorine's place, the work in the west country was provided for S. Middleton and Mr. V. A. Madsen, and eventually became, in 1912, first rector of the congregation on the South Hill and Mr. Payne worked chiefly on the South Hill and Mr. McMorine helped in the parish. In 1912, the Rev. A. B. Payne and Mr. McMorine's son, Mr. Middlewood and Mr. V. A. Madsen, were appointed to the parish of St. George's.
