Snake river, in Bromley township, Renfrew  
County, 19 miles south of Pembroke, the  
county seat and nearest banking point, and  
7 south-west of Cobden, on the C P Ry, its  
nearest railway station. It is on the daily  
stage route from Cobden to Eganville.  
Population, 40. Mail daily. Timothy Gor-  
man, postmaster and blacksmith.

**BULLOCK'S CORNERS.** A village  
on Morden's creek, in West Flamboro' town-  
ship, Wentworth County, 7 miles west of  
Hamilton, the county seat, and 1 mile from  
Dundas, on the G W div G T Ry, its nearest  
shipping and banking point. It contains  
woollen and flour mills, an Episcopal church  
and public school, and ships flour, woollens,  
grain and produce. Stages daily to Hamil-  
ton, Dundas, West Flamboro', Bookton,  
Sheffield, Greensville, Haysland, Strabane,  
Freelton, Puslinch, Aberfoyle, Guelph and  
Morriston, fare 5c per mile. Population,  
200. Mail daily. W J Morden, postmaster.
