NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C.—The British Columbia Power & Electric Co. are seeking permission to develop power from the Squishish river.—Extensive additions are to be made to the Columbia Cold Storage Co.'s plant.

HALIFAX, N. S.—Cram, Goodhue & Ferguson, architects, New York, have prepared the plans for the new Anglican Cathedral to be erected in this city.—City Council want tenders up to March 14 h for erection of fire station.

MEDICINE HAT, SASK.—The Medicine Hat Milling Co. will erect a large elevator here and several smaller buildings in neighboring villages.—Reports are current that large car shops are to be erected just east of the city.

MAISONNEUVE, QUE.—A by-law authorizing the borrowing of \$400,000 for public improvements has been carried by the ratepayers. A number of the proprietors are, however, endeavoring to have the by-law declared irregular.

HENSALL P. O., ONT.—A. G. Smilie is taking tenders up to March 15th for construction of steel reinforced concrete abutments and floors for eight bridges in Township of Tuckersmith. Plans with above named gentleman.

GUELPH, ONT.—W. J. Fleming will receive tenders up to March 13th for stone, brick, carpenter, iron, lath and plastering and other trades required in erection of nine semi-detached houses. Plans with L. C. Wideman, architect.

PETERBORO, ONT.—The Prepayment Electric Meter Co. will erect a new factory.—F. Mason has purchased property on which to erect a large residence.—The Charlotte Methodist church congregation are considering the erection of a new edifice, having a seating capacity for 1,000 persons.

MEAFORD, ONT.—G. G. 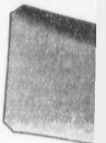
