Veterinary.

Steer was dehorned two years ago. Near the seat of the operation there is now a growth as large as a man's fist. It is not sore, but is somewhat raw and A. b.

Ans.-This is an epithelial tumor, or wart. It should be carefully dissected off, and the raw surface dressed three times daily with a five-per-cent. solution of carbolic in water until healed.

HAIR FALLING PREMATURELY -BREWERS' GRAINS.

1. What is the feeding value of malt from a brewery?

2. Would it be cheap food at 5 cents per bushel, as compared with oats at 40 cents per bushel, and bran at \$22 per ton?

3. What is the best way to keep it for one week? We tried some last week, and only threw it in a pile in the stable, but before the week was over it was spoiled.

4. What is it the best feed for : Cows, fattening cattle, pigs, and how would it be for idle horses?

5. What causes the hair to drop off the heads and necks of cattle in the winter and spring? Some of our cattle were nearly bare last spring, and in January of this year the same cattle started P. J. D. again.

Ans.-1. Our inquirer does not specify whether he means malt sprouts, wet brewers' grains, or dry brewers' grains. Perhaps the best way to answer his question will be to submit a comparison of analyses :

Brewers' grains, dried 15.7	36.3	5.1

From this, it will appear that malt sprouts (the tiny sprouts originating from the barley grains in the process of malting, and separated after being dried, by sieving) have the highest percentage of protein, and, theoretically, should be the most valuable. Unfortunately, this feed is not much relished by cattle, hence can be fed only in limited quantities. Wet brewers' grains can only be fed in the vicinity of a brewery. Supplied in reasonable amount while fresh, and fed in water-tight boxes which are kept clean, with nutritious hay and other coarse fodder, there is no better feed for dairy cows. Fed in leaky wooden mangers in a stale or decaying condition, wet brewers' grains make unwholesome and unsatisfactory feed. Dried brewers' grain make an excellent concentrated feed, rich in protein, no more perishable than bran and ranking with bran and oil meal in palatibility and general good effects. This feed has also been used for horses with good results.

2. Yes; unless one had to haul it a long distance. For instance, take bran as a basis of comparison. A brewer gives 48 to 50 lbs. as the weight of a bushel of brewers' grains; this would make the price \$2 a ton. Twenty-two dollars would purchase in one ton of bran 224 lbs. protein, 784 lbs. carbohydrates, and 54 lbs. ether extract; whereas \$22 would purchase in 11 tons (more or less) of wet brewers' grains 858 lbs. protein, 2,046 lbs. carbohydrates, and 308 lbs. ether extract; or, in terms of proportion, 31 times as much protein, over 21 times as much carbohydrates, and over 51 times as much ether extract as bran.

3. Wet brewers' grains will not keep for any length of time. They should be obtained fresh every few days, the oftener the better.

4. Owing to the high percentage of protein contained, and to the succulence thereof, wet brewers' grains are of special

value for dairy cows. 5. Lice are generally the cause of cattle losing their hair in winter. Ringworm has the same effect, but it is known by a scurf or scale in spots around the eyes and on the neck. Oil, or grease, with a little petroleum in it, will kill lice, and a mixture of sulphur and lard, or oil, is a simple remedy for ringworm. TWICE AS STRONG
