4. The OUTLINES may next be review ed. provided the school has given them due attention during the quarter. Let the initials be written, the title of each lesson announced, and the outline repeated by the school or class.

Select from the above only as much as can be taught in the allotted time. 4. Do not dwell too long on each section. 5. Make the review pointed, practical and spiritual
