

may be the most interesting operation was the moving of the old rail to the outside of the track where it could be picked up by the salvage train. The discarded steel was not unbolted, being one end of this rail was times half a mile in length. The other end of this rail was attached to a new track and as a heavily weighted truck was pushed slowly by a powerful engine, so the phlanges on its foremost wheels showed the old rail over the new to the outside of the track—a simple operation, but one which, in course of time, has saved the Commission many thousands of dollars. As a matter of fact, this system of re-laying track, practised first by the Canadian Pacific on the Megantic Subdivision, has attracted the attention of railroad officials in other countries. As a result, many of whom are now here, representatives from as far as Japan and China, to secure first hand knowledge of it and the special unloading equipment used.

A special return trip under similar arrangements for those who care to take it has also been planned. Starting from Victoria, it includes the wonderful run through the mountains over the Kettle Valley Railway, the steamer trips over beautiful Okanagan and Kootenay Lakes, through the heart of the Fraser Valley country, thence to Lake Okanagan and by motor over the splendid new Banff-Lake Windermere Highway to the Vermilion River Camp and Banff. Then come Edmonton, the prosperous gateway to Canada's rich Northland, Saskatoon, an important prairie city, Winnipeg, Kenora, Port William and across the lake to the lakeside resort of Vermilion River. This trip lasts from August 15 to September 29, and includes a stop-over for breakfast at lovely Lake Windermere Camp, lunch at Vermilion River Camp, and a day at Banff, Edmonton, Winnipeg and Devil's Gap Camp, the delightful resort on the Lake of the Woods, near the border. The visits to the camps, the motor trips through the mountains and the refreshing lake across the Great Lakes alone make this return trip infinitely desirable.
