LEGEND OF THE TOPAZ

Why the Jewel Is Called the Stone of Gratitude.

The topas is called the stone of grati-tude, and the old Roman books record the following legend, from which the stone derives this attribute:


The blind Emperor Theodosins used to hang a brasen gong before his pal-sce gates and sit beside it on certain days, hearing and putting to rights the grievances of any of his subjects. Those who wished for his advice and help had but to sound the gong, and immediately admission into the pres-ence of Caesar was obtained. One day a great snake crept up to the gate and struck the brazen gong with her colls, and Theodosius gave orders that no one should molest the creature and bade her tell him of her wish. The snake bent her crest lowly in

Night fell, and the sleeping world had for-gotten the emperor's kindly deed, but with the early dawn a great serpent gitled into the palace, up the steps and into the royal chamber and laid upon each of the emperor's closed cyclids a gleaming topaz.


