#### NO DECISION ON NAVAL POLICY.

Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, Minister of Naval Service, in the House to-day, made his awaited statement on the Canadian naval policy. He intimated in this, practically repeating his statement of some weeks ago, that no decision of a permanent naval policy be reached till after the next Imperial Conference in 1921, but supplementary estimates were to be brought down this session for two millions and a quarter dollars. He gave details of a cruiser, two destroyers and two subs, which are a gift to Canada of the Imperial Government and in passing, cited an important, and hitherto unpublished memorandum presented by overseas Premiers to the British Ad-

### BILL WILL PASS.

LONDON, June 15. Governmental determination to pass the Irish Home Rule Bill was expressed in a long, emphatic statement to the Commons when the discussion of the Bill in committee stage was resumed by the House yesterday. The members were warned "that any supposition of an intention to abandon the easure is quite illusory." Some obrvations were made during the consideration of an amendment to the measure, moved by Sir Edward Carson, and designed to omit a section of the Bill giving control of Irish railways to Irish Council.

#### MURDER CONSPIRACY.

LONDON, June 15. the Soviet Government reported from Moscow, says an Exchange Telegraph despatch from Berlin, dated Sunday. The plan was to murder Premier Lenine and Bucharin, President of the third international, during the May Day celebrations.
