Household Notes.

Mushroom sauce is good with veal. An egg and rice omelet is a good breakfast dish. Serve apple-and-nut salad with a cream dressing. Do not use potatoes with the least bit of rot in them. Pumpkin-and-raisin tarts are novel and delicious. Use lemon juice in place of vinegar in salad dressings. Never put salt into a stew until the meat is almost done. Spaghetti is good cooked with cheese and sweet peppers. Cream of wheat is nice served with chopped figs and milk. Serve orange ice cream with strips of candied orange peel. Jellyed bouillon is very attractive when put through the potato ricer. A tomato appetizer is appropriate to serve with a chicken dinner. Salsify is good baked with buttered crumbs, cheese and white sauce.
