

Jury Declare

DEATH OF HER HUSBAND COURT APPLAUDS.

Mme. Marie Marguerite Fahmy tay was acquifted of the murder ier Egyptian husband, Ali Kame Fahmy Bey, by a jury in Old Bailey, onsisting of ten men and two wo-nen. The trial, which had lasted for ive days, was sensational and of abrbing interest to most of the coun-

rtroom when the verdict was seldom is heard in a courtro land, and caused Justice Swift to dict. In answer to the question from the clerk of the court whether Marie Marguerite Fahmy was guilty of mur-der, the foreman answered: "Not

standing near the accused woman explained the verdict. She sank raised up her limp figure. One of the jurywomen burst into tears. Justice Swift directed the inter-

preter to tell Mme Fahmy that she was discharged, adding: "Let her the woman stood facing him. During the trial, it was said that the husband had repeatedly threaten-ed her life. Mme Fahmy produced in court a secret document which she had left with her lawyer in Cairo in which she said that in the event of her death or disappearance her husband would be to blame. His brutal treatment of his wife was stressed by

Mme. Fahmy's Egyptian lawyer says that a very complicated question now arises regarding her right to a portion of her husband's estate, which is understood to be very large.
