Local Market.

The market presented a cheerful scene this morning. Offerings were in excess of the demand in many lines, and business was not exactly brisk, but the day was pleasant and welcome contrast to Saturday's dreariness and people looked happy. There were no marked changes in values. Eggs were dearer than for some time past, 17c being the highest price reached. Butter remained stationary, but quite firm. The fruit market was active. Prices were as follows: Peaches, per basket, 50c to 60c; plums, 50c to 75c; grapes, per 10-lb basket, 20c to 35c; pears, 50c to 75c per basket; apples, 50c to 75c per basket. Pears are about done. A lot of inferior grade apples, not suitable for shipping, were offered at various prices ranging from 30c to 75c a bag.
