Eighteen Days Since Millionaire and His Son Were Heard

From. New York, Nov. 22.-One of the most persistent searches ever made of the seas for a missing craft continued throughout the eighteenth day today with wireless perplexities, adding to the difficulties of friends who are trying to ascertain the whereabouts Col. John Jacob Astor and his private

yacht Nourmahal. The fact that the West Indies region is only a few hundred miles away and is provided with modern means of communication, telegraph, cable and wireless, which are now crippled, and that ships are constantly plying these waters, only makes the search more

nteresting. Col. Astor's friends and relatives ave been worried one day by stories shipwreck and cheered the next by reports that the yacht was undoubtedly safe. The latest and most positive of these reports came from Caracas today when the captain of he Caracas reported with certainty hat it was the Astor yacht which he had seen safely at anchor in San Juan, Porto Rico, on Nov. 15, or after

the hurricane had passed. Wm, A. Dobbyn, secretary of the Astor estate, is making every effort to get an answer from San Juan. Reports from San Domingo today said the Nourmahal had sailed from there on Nov. 12 in the face of a hurricane, but Mr. Dobbyn believes that Col. Astor is too careful a seaman to leave a safe anchorage in the teeth of a storm.

Although Key West succeeded in getting messages through to San Juan today no reply confirming the presence of the Nourmahal had been received up to tonight, and it is possible that the yacht has put out again for a cruise and that the party aboard is still ignorant of the anxiety felt here.
