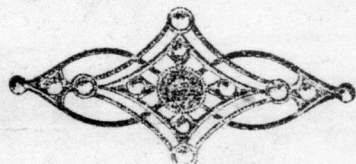

THE PRIVATE CITIZEN AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Dr. H. W. Hill's Address to the Baraca Class of Talbot St. Church.

A large number of men attended the first of a series of lectures given under the auspices of the men's Baraca Bible class of Talbot Street Baptist Church last evening, when Dr. H. W. Hill, director of the Institute of Public Health, gave a most able address on "The Private Citizen's Duty Toward Public Health."

Dr. Hill spoke for upwards of an hour, outlining the mission of the public health branch of a community. He said that the duties of such a department were often misunderstood. It is a mistake to think the public health department should confine its work too much to a garbage system, the removing of dead animals and the cleaning up of a city's rubbish. The main duty should be to deal directly with persons infected with infectious diseases, to find out the source of all epidemics, and as far as possible to remove the causes of infectious diseases.

Dr. Hill led a very hearty discussion as to the work of his branch of municipal work. The London Male Chorus under the direction of Mr. E. Fowles and Mr. Fred Dowling, rendered a number of vocal selections during the evening. Mr. A. M. Overholt moved a vote of thanks to Dr. Hill for his kind-

WATER COMS. NOW ASK THE CITY FOR MONEY

Overdraft for \$40,000 Exists

Owing to Fact That Debentures Were Not Sold.

At the regular meeting of the water commissioners held on Thursday afternoon, it was decided to ask the city for a loan of \$50,000 to carry the board through the year.

Chairman Pocock reported that debentures amounting to \$125,000 had not been sold during the year, because of an unfavorable market. As a result the capital expenditure for mains, electrical machinery, etc., had to be met out of current revenue. The waterworks could stand this, as there was a surplus. However, in the electrical department there was an overdraft of some \$40,000 in the Molems Bank. The money could be secured from the city, and he advised that this be done. Mr. Pocock also reported that the city had paid but \$7,500 for street lighting when \$30,000 were due the commission.

On motion of Commissioner Chapman, it was decided to ask the council for the necessary money.

Horton Street Plant Accounts.

General Manager Glaubitz informed the commissioners that the account between Hon. A. M. Beck and the commission relative to the Horton street pumping plant would be closed within a few days, and a statement would be submitted to the board.

Mr. Glaubitz reported that he had received no communication from the city council in reply to his letter to the effect that the commissioners were prepared to take down the extra lights on Dundas street, if the aldermen so desired.

"They do not acknowledge the lamps are up," said Commissioner Chapman.

Commissioner Marr presented the report of the parks commissions. It was passed without comment.

Those present were Chairman Philip Pocock, Commissioners J. H. Chapman, John Marr, Dr. H. A. Stevenson, Mayor Graham, General Manager Glaubitz and Secretary Ellwood.

BISHOP SPEAKS OF ANGLICAN CHURCH

Two Prevailing Misconceptions in Regard to the Church of England.

A WARNING TO A. Y. P. A.

His Lordship Declares That It was the Church of England That Gave the Bible to the World.

The Bishop of Huron, in a masterly address to the combined gathering of the Anglican Young Peoples' Associations of the Anglican Church, held in the Cronyn Memorial Church on Thursday evening, outlined to the young people what their duty was in breaking down the prevailing misconceptions relating to their church. The bishop referred to the A. Y. P. A. as one of the most hopeful features in church life, and stated that there were two prevailing misconceptions in regard to the Church of England, which they were to fight against. The first misbelief was that only a paper wall existed between it and a certain other church. In reply to this, he would say that the Church of England had been a hearty vote of thanks to the religious errors of the mediaeval period. It was their denomination which gave the Bible to the people of the world. The other misconception was that the church was not a spiritual factor in Christianity. This was partly due to the church's attitude toward amusements. Some people thought that religious commandments, such as don't smoke, don't dance, don't play cards, etc.

Religion a Positive Thing. Instead of this, the bishop stated that the church taught that religion was a positive thing, dealing with the inward man, and those factors which in building up a being, which was developed from all standpoints. In conclusion, he pointed out that the hope of the Anglican Church was based on the young people. The bishop said that over 500 of the old and young congregated together in the auditorium and spent a most enjoyable social evening.

The Program.

Rev. Mr. Heakes, who filled the chair for the musical part of the rally, called on Messrs. Ellis, McCutcheon, Taylor, Percy, and Morton. Misses Hoskins and Elliott, and Mrs. Cooke, for solo selections.

All these musical numbers were well received, as was also Miss Lillian McKenzie's recitation. The Sunday school orchestra, under the fine direction of Mr. Heakes, played several numbers throughout the evening.

On the platform with Bishop Williams were Mrs. R. W. Norwood and Mrs. Williams, who were presented with fine flowers by the A. Y. P. A. of Memorial Church.

Light refreshments were served at the close of the program, and the rally was dispersed with the benediction, pronounced by the bishop.
