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KENT AND ESSEX BIG PRODUCERS OF WHITE BURLEY

Tobacco Growing in Canada Has Made Rapid Advances.

OTTAWA, July 26.—(By Canadian Press.) Tobacco growing in Canada has advanced by leaps and bounds during recent years. Of White Burley, a staple tobacco used for all purposes, the production for 1920 was 20,000,000 pounds, as against only 4,000,000 pounds in 1915.

A bulletin issued by the department of agriculture states that practically all the White Burley was grown in Kent and Essex Counties, Ontario. The United States has 400,000 acres devoted to this species alone, while Canada has so far 20,000 acres. Some 400,000,000 pounds is grown annually, and a market is found in Europe, as well as on this continent.

Most of the oats is now harvested, and altogether are a light crop. Corn was never known to make such rapid growth. Some of the stalks have already attained a height of from ten to twelve feet, and well-developed ears of corn have formed.

Fowl buyers have been out in this vicinity and have purchased ducks at from 15 cents to 20 cents per pound, and hens at 20 cents per pound. The fowl are taken by auto direct to the Detroit market.

Red raspberries have been very plentiful and have been selling at 20 cents per box. Thimbleberries are also very abundant.

Tomatoes are now on the local market at 30 cents per pound. Miss Evelyn Baines of Longwood has been engaged as teacher of the Wabash Public School at a salary of \$800. Her duties commence on September 1.

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WHEAT AVERAGES 25 BUSHEL PER ACRE AT WABASH

Corn Is Making Record Growth As Result of Heat.
