

The subject under discussion was the question of provincial rights ; the argument of the Free Press was that the guarantee for those rights was found in the fact that the federal government are responsible to a parliament composed of representatives of

parliament composed of representatives of the various provinces, each interested in their maintenance, the following being its statement of the case : "The parliament of Canada is composed of representatives of the seven provinces, each of which has, in its provincial char-acter, like political rights. Ministers, whose tenure of office depends upon their retaining the confidence of a parliament so composed, are not likely to abuse a power, the exercise of which would obviously be jealously watched by representatives from all the provinces, since each is alike inter-ested in the maintenance of provincial rights, and therefore in the principles upon which the power of disallowance is exer-cised. For the same reason any abuse by ministers of this power would be quickly followed by the application of the constitu-tional remedy by parliament."
