In our columns this morning, we give a Summary of the news.

ST. ANDREWS & QUEBEC RAILROAD.
We have much pleasure in announcing the arrival of Mr. NEALE, the Engineer of the Saint Andrews & Quebec Railroad, who came passenger in the steamship America, and arrived here on Friday evening. We understand that he intends commencing operations immediately upon the line. It is also gratifying to learn, that nearly the whole amount of stock has been taken up in England.

Mr. Neal accompanied by Messrs Wightman, and Mahood commenced his survey of the line on Saturday last, and had reached the upper end of the Chamcook lakes, where he resumes the survey this morning, and will proceed direct to Woodstock.

The new Steamer S. B. Wheeler, commanded by Capt. Mithener, visited our harbour on Monday last, and took a large party to St. George, to witness the general Muster of the 2d bat. Charlotte Militia.—She is a swift boat, and beautifully fitted up, the accommodations being of the best description.

Several articles intended for this day's paper, have been unavoidably postponed until our next number. The training at Saint George we will notice in our next.

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE IN QUEBEC.—A fire occurred in Quebec on Saturday last, which consumed 25 buildings, occasioning a loss of about 25,000— which is mostly covered by insurance. It is supposed to have been the work of an incendiary.

Destruction of the Carleton Iron Works by Fire!—We regret to learn that the buildings belonging to the Carleton Iron Company, at Woodstock, were accidentally destroyed by fire on Wednesday last. All the extensive buildings connected with the Company's Works were consumed, but the extent of the damage to the apparatus and machinery used in the manufacture of iron has not been ascertained. There was no insurance on the Works, and the loss will probably not be less than £3000 to 4000. We sincerely regret this disaster, as it has for the present checked the usefulness of a Company which promised so much good to the Country generally.—16.
