

Commercial Summary.

It is proposed to form a joint stock company with a capital of \$100,000 for starting waggon-works in St. Thomas.

The Acadia Fire Insurance Company of Halifax has declared a dividend of five per cent. on the past half year's business.

The revised regulations in connection with the cigar and tobacco industries have been approved of by Order-in-Council at Ottawa.

AMERICAN capitalists, as well as Canadian are evincing an increasing interest in asbestos mining, and several sales of lands have recently been reported.

The Bank of Halifax has declared a dividend for the current six months at the rate of seven per cent per annum.—Owen Sound, Ont., has been made a port of entry for tobacco also.

The Canada Worsted Factory, at Quebec, has been leased to the Riverside Worsted Company for five years. The lessees have already commenced work, and will turn out large quantities of goods.

The shareholders of "The Chambly Cotton Co.," with a capital of \$100,000, are applying for letters patent. The original promoters were: Messrs. John Rankin and John Beattie, of Montreal, and S. Greenwood, James Walsl, and W. J. R. Beattie, of Chambly.

On May 31st the amount in the Government Savings bank to the credit of depositors was \$11,916,862, or an increase of \$1,076,220 over that on the 31st December last. The Department says this increase is a testimony of the prosperity of the people.

The tinware stock of James Chalmers of Strathroy, Ont., was sold by auction in London last week for 50 cts in the dollar, the purchaser being Mr. Wm. Wyate, London, for Mr. Chalmers. Having got another start we hope he may now go on and prosper.

Messrs. Costello Bros., grocers and lumber dealers, Renfrew, Ont., have held a meeting of creditors, with a view to arranging a compromise.—T. H. LOCKINARON, furniture dealer in Toronto, lately assigned, and the assets have been advertised for sale by the trustee.
