### The Week.

#### HOME NEWS.

A company has been organized in St. John for the manufacture of furniture and other articles in wood.

A letter from Sir John Macdonald, received by the last mail, states that he is daily growing in strength, and that he will sail for home on September 8th.—*Montreal Gazette.*

The capabilities of Cape Breton as an oil-producing country are pronounced to be second to neither Pennsylvania nor Ontario oil region in their best days. About forty wells are going down or are under contract.—*Maritime Journal.*

Hull, Aug. 15.—The *Cornwall* line has secured the *S. S. Claribel* to be put on this route in place of the wrecked *"Comet."* The *"Claribel"* is an iron vessel of 1100 tons, built at Liverpool, U. B., in 1872, with four watertight bulkheads.

Dalhousie, N. B., Aug. 15.—The spool factory lately erected at Jacques River, County Restigouche, and only in operation a few months, was totally destroyed by fire early on the morning of Friday, 12th. There is said to be some insurance, but the loss is very heavy.

Among the prominent Canadians who have recently obtained their majorities in the British army, are Capt. Hilliard H. A. Cameron, eldest son of the late Hon. J. Hilliard Cameron, and Capt. Vincent K. Biscoe, Commander of the 16th Bedfordshire, and the latter of the 47th, or Loyal North Lancashire.

Ottawa, Aug. 15.—The following is a statement of Dominion Revenue and Expenditure as shown by returns to 30th June:—Revenue—Customs, \$1,451,938; Excise, \$703,967.91; Post office, \$175,520.55; Public Works, including Railways, \$2,164,637.93; Bill Stamps, \$18,277.24; Miscellaneous, \$57,533.57. Expenditure, \$2,497,484.28. The total value of the exports of the Dominion for June was \$13,247,784.

The Intercolonial Railway Receipts for the month of July were \$165,063, against \$146,713 for the month last year. The increase for the month is therefore \$18,350, or about 11 per cent. The increase for the seven months of this year has been \$106,280. Every month of the year shows an increase over the receipts for corresponding month last year, and withstanding the immense increase last year over 1879.

The prospectus of the Lachine (Quebec) Cotton Company has been issued. The capital is \$200,000 in 2,000 shares of \$100 each. The provisional directors are Hon. J. J. C. Abbott, S. Carley, John McDougall, Wm. Owens, and E. C. Ireland. It is proposed to erect a mill of about 15,000 spindles at Lachine as well as soon as possible, for manufacturing cotton fabrics. The company talk of shoe drills as a specialty in their manufacturing business.

Messrs. James Harris & Co., of St. John, have found it necessary to enlarge their premises to facilitate their increasing business. They purpose erecting, at once, a new moulding shop and a large shed for the building of railway cars. The building in which the cars are now made is being fitted up with all kinds of machinery, such as planing and rotary saws. With this plant all the wood material used in the construction of the carriages can be prepared. A separate engine and boiler is being fitted up to run the machinery.

Sackville, N. B., Aug. 12.—The damage to the crop and pasture marsh is estimated by some at \$20,000, by others at \$60,000; probably \$30,000 will cover all the losses. Several repaired places in the dykes on Ram Pasture Marsh were washed out by last night's tide. It is impossible to keep the water out, and the farmers are very much excited in consequence. All the hay down will be ruined, and the rest is more or less damaged. Grain on the marshes will be spoiled. In some places the road has been washed out on the marsh, and the green holds so much grit it will be almost impossible to cut.

#### NEWS FROM ABROAD.

Buffalo, N. Y., Aug. 11.—Mrs. Fillmore, widow of the Ex-President, died to-night, aged 70.

London, Aug. 11.—The deanery of Westminster has been offered to the Rev. Henry Montagu Butler, head master of Harrow School, who will probably accept.

Vienna, Aug. 11.—A boat race between the Cornell University Crew and an Austrian crew, selected from four rowing clubs of Vienna, was rowed on the Danube today. The course was one mile and a half. The Vienna crew won.

London, Aug. 15.—The marriage of the Duke of Argyll to the daughter of the Rev. Dr. Thomas Leitch Claxton, Bishop of St. Albans, was solemnized today at the Episcopal Palace, and was quite private. The bride is a niece of Earl Dalrymple.

London, August 12.—The House of Lords finished the debate on the Land Bill. All the competent amendments have been restored. A cabinet council will be held today to consider the course to be adopted by the Government in regard to the Bill. The *Standard* this morning says: "The supporters of the Government regard the situation as very serious. We understand Gladstone will not give way on any points he regards as vital, and that he will prefer to lose the bill altogether this year."
