In terms of opposition, "Sending Canadian human rights experts to help monitor peace accords" and "Strengthening the ability of the United Nations to mediate potential conflicts" both received opposition (strongly or somewhat) from about one eighth (13%) of the population, while just over one in ten (11%) opposed "Giving assistance to both sides that sign a peace agreement to help them implement that peace agreement".


CHILD LABOUR IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Perceived Causes Of Child Labour In Developing Countries

Poverty was the most commonly (41%) cited cause of child labour in developing countries. Other perceived causes include exploitation by employers (16%), government indifference (13%), lack of education (11%), exploitation by parents (6%), corruption (4%) and homelessness (1%).
