BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Danielle Vincent began her career with the Canadian government in 1970 in Ottawa, where she held various positions in fields related to human resources, international relations and operational policy.

In 1992, she was appointed Regional Director, Real Property Services, for the Department of Public Works and Government Services. In 1994, she became Director of the Montreal Tax Services Office for Revenue Canada, then Assistant Deputy Minister of Regional Operations for Revenue Canada–Quebec Region.

Since July 12, 1999, as Assistant Deputy Minister for Human Resources Development Canada–Quebec Region,* she manages a wide range of labour, employment, labour market, income security and social development programs.

Over the past eight years, Ms Vincent has served as Chair and Vice-Chair of the Quebec Federal Council. The Quebec Federal Council is composed of the most senior executives of federal institutions with activities in Quebec. Its mandate consists of promoting the horizontal management of federal interventions and activities in the province of Quebec.
