Some United Nations peacekeeping involvements have been financed by assessment, while others have been paid for by voluntary contributions. Until 1956, with the exception of Korea (which did not engage the financing machinery of the United Nations), the relatively modest costs were included in the regular budget.

With the establishment of UNEF I in 1956 and ONUC in 1960, costs mounted considerably. Some countries, including the Soviet Union and France, did not contribute, contending that peacekeeping was the prerogative of the Security Council and that the General Assembly had overstepped its authority by establishing the two
