

RUDOLPH DUDER

Mr. Duder was born in St. John's, Newfoundland, on March 16, 1912, and is a graduate of McGill University. A Rhodes Scholar for Newfoundland, he obtained a B.A. and M.A. at Oxford. He was at one time an Associate Professor at Memorial University College, St. John's. During World War II Mr. Duder served overseas with the Newfoundland Regiment and was a member of the Allied Military Government Team for Berlin at the end of the war. Following his discharge as a Major in 1947, Mr. Duder remained in Germany as a member of the Military Government Organization until he joined the Department of External Affairs in 1950. Mr. Duder has served abroad at our Embassy in Belgrade and since November 1954 has been Canadian Commissioner in Phnom Penh. He is single.
