RAILWAY ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—FREE CONFERENCE.

Mr. SPEAKER informed the House that a message had been received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate accedes to the request of the House of Commons for a free conference to consider the Bill No. 19 (Letter A of the Senate), intitled: "An Act to consolidate and amend the Railway Act," and any amendments which at such conference it may be desirable to make thereto, and had appointed
