ferred to the provinces over and above what they thought they were going to get. It is a debit to the federal treasury. There is no doubt about that. It is in addition to what we estimated we were going to pay. It is a credit to the provinces over and above what they thought they would get. Therefore, it is a real transfer that enhances the ability of the provincial governments to finance medicare and post-secondary education. Quite frankly, I hope that those are the purposes to which the provinces put the money.
