LONDON, Dec. 6.—It is reported in London that the German people are becoming alarmed over the apparent inability of the emperor's troops to check the invasion of the empire in East Prussia, in Alsace and in Lorraine.

Since an invading army that ceases to invade and takes up the defensive loses its quality of being formidable, so much more does the country whence the invaders came lose cast when it, in turn, is invaded.

Two huge French forces are marching forward yesterday, one pursuing its way northward toward Metz, in Lorraine, while the other is pushing toward the Rhine by way of Aitkirch, where the French and Germans, it was reported Saturday, had engaged in a battle in the west.

Germany is said to have relinquished all attempts of an aggressive campaign in the west.

In preparation for the battle, the right wing of the army of France has been doubled in strength, and south of Metz an attempt is being made to cut all communication of the Germans between Metz and St. Mihiel.

A new aggressive movement in the direction of Roulers, which stronghold serves as one of the bases of German operations in Belgium, has been organized by the allies, aided in considerable measure by their capture of important positions east of the River Yser.
