before People's Eyes were open, and his Credit failed him? But admit, for a Moment, that this was the true Cause of his Refignation. Is it a Point so undeniably clear, that we ought immediately to enter into a War with Spain, as not to leave Room for any Doubt? Might there not be those of a more sedate and calm Temper, who, without Offence, might think such a Step too precipitate, and might possibly wish that every just Expedient was first tried before War was declared, which once begun, who knows where and when it may end? fure, too, in our present Circumstances, which are entirely owing to this Gentleman's Conduct, that without abandoning Germany, which I don't find that he ever intended, we could carry on such a War any long Time without Risk of a National
