PLAN of the TOWN of QUEBEC, the Capital of CANADA in NORTH AMERICA,  
with the Basin and a part of the Adjacent Country, Shewing the principal Encampments and Works of the British Army Commanded by MAJOR-GENERAL WOLFE,  
and those of the French Army Commanded by LIEUT. GENERAL the MARQUIS of MONTCAUIM, during the Siege of that Place in 1759.

N.B.—The different parts were surveyed as follows: viz. The east side of the Falls of Montmorency, The Point of Orleans and the south side of the River St. Lawrence by Capt. Debeig, Engineer in Ordinary. The Coast of Benport from the River St. Charles to the Falls of Montmorency by Captain Holland of the Royal Americans, Assistant Engineer. The Ground between the River St. Lawrence and the River St. Charles by Lient. Des Barres of the Royal Americans, Assistant Engineer.

In preparing the notes for the battle of Ste. Foy use has been made of a "Plan of the Battle fought the 28th of April, 1760, upon the Height of Abraham near Quebec," by Patrick Mackellar, Major, Chief Engineer.
